5. Citizens To Be Heard

Dean Meyer, from the Moorhead Youth Baseball program spoke out that they are planning on building an indoor turf facility. They want it on the north side of Centennial Park, close to their baseball complex. The Moorhead Legion Baseball, Moorhead Crush, and Lacrosse have shown interest in the utilization of this facility. The requested location is currently where the complex has its concession stand and bathrooms. Sean and Paul had emailed Dean and expressed that they would prefer them to be on the south side, west of the current softball fields. Dean asks that there be more in-depth discussions about a northern location.

6. Business

A. Friendship Park designation in honor of Friendship City Partnership with Zakho Kurdistan

In July of 2025, leaders from the City of Moorhead and the City of Zakho, Kurdistan, held a historic proclamation ceremony at MSUM, formally establishing a Friendship City partnership between the two communities. Moorhead is home to an estimated 3,500 Kurdish residents, representing approximately 8% of the city's population. To honor this relationship locally, while also allowing communities of all nationalities a place where they can feel welcome. With Moorhead being a vibrant, caring

community, and home to over 63 spoken languages daily. Gihon, from the Kurdish community, said that they want to add to the park and will do their own fundraising to add those park-approved additions.

B. Receive Updates on the Golf Courses

In the Fall of 2025, staff identified a significant opportunity to streamline and modernize the way season passes are purchased and used at both the Municipal Pool and the City's golf courses. In the past, they could only purchase them during weekday, business hours and this placed substantial administrative demand on staff during the peak season. Through our software, Sportsman, we explored the use of QR codes for our memberships. We were able to put our passes available to purchase online to make it more convenient for our community members and staff. Anyone can set up an account and once they have completed their steps and made their purchase, the QR code is then emailed to them and also available in their online account. They would scan their QR code at the entrance and then the user's photo would pop up, and then we would verify we have the right person for the right pass. With these changes, we will also be able to gather data on how often or how long people utilize their memberships.

7. Information/Update

A. Hjemkomst Rope Replacement Project

In 2024, a William Crooks crew member came and told us that the ropes need to be replaced and that some of the ropes were coming up on 50 years old. We contracted with a vendor from California, Courtney Andersen to assess and replace the ropes. The City received a grant for \$10,000 from the MN Historical Society, as well as utilizing funds from the repair and replacement fund.

B. Native Prairie – Control Burn

The City has been working with a regional contractor to maintain our prairie lands and for several years they have been recommending a controlled burn and this year the weather finally cooperated. They were successful to burn three sites, Homestead Park, Toll Bridge area, and Probstfield and had regrowth within a couple of weeks.

C. Unauthorized Structures – Homestead Park

There was a homeless camp type structure found by the river and Paul reviewed their procedure for those situations. Once our office is notified, we do reach out to all the working groups: CAPLP, Community Action, and our Law Enforcement PD. We mark it on a map, then Community Action will send out their field team and make contact with that person staying there and help them find services, food, and or housing. Contacting that person can sometimes take 1-2 weeks and so we leave a notice saying that it needs to be cleaned up, per City code. We give them two weeks from the notice date and then park staff will go and dispose of anything that needs to be disposed of.

The other structure that was found was a dangerous bike ramp that was installed on a bike trail. We posted these structures and were able to make contact and have a meeting set up with the group that was in charge of setting up that ramp to discuss what they are trying to accomplish and make sure it is done safely for all.

D. Senior Program Updates

Recently surveyed the Moorhead Senior Center and Sean reviewed the results. There were many that were interested in fitness, and so we implemented a SAIL program, and it's going so well that we are doing it all year round. It was helpful to see where our seniors receive their information from and how often they participate at the Senior Center. This information will help us determine what we will implement next and continue our growth of services for our seniors.

SUBJECT: Key / Damage Deposit

RECOMMENDATION: The Park Advisory Board is asked to approve the recommendation of adding a key / damage deposit on all MB Johnson Small Shelter Rentals

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

Moorhead Parks and Recreation requires a refundable security deposit for facility rentals involving alcohol service or events with more than 100 attendees. This policy ensures that renters remain accountable for their guests and return the rented facility in the condition in which it was originally received.

Over the past two summers, staff have identified operational challenges specific to rentals at the MB Johnson Small Shelter. A number of these events do not meet the existing criteria for requiring a deposit, yet still present consistent issues related to key pick-up and communication with renters. In several cases, renters have not responded to staff attempts to coordinate key distribution. When this occurs, Parks staff must dispatch either the Parks Manager or an on-call Park Maintenance employee, often resulting in overtime expenses, simply to unlock the shelter for the rental.

To reduce unnecessary strain on staff resources, improve renter accountability, and ensure consistent use of departmental procedures, staff recommend instituting a standard key/damage deposit for all reservations of the MB Johnson Small Shelter, regardless of event size or alcohol presence.

This change would:

- Ensure timely key pick-up and improve communication expectations for all renters.
- Reduce reliance on emergency or after-hours staff response.
- Better protect City property by reinforcing renter responsibility.

Implementing this deposit requirement will support operational efficiency, reduce overtime costs, and maintain the quality and integrity of the MB Johnson Small Shelter for community use.

SUBJECT: Recommendation – 5 Year Capital Improvement Requests 2027 Budget

RECOMMENDATION: Approve the requested and make a recommendation to the City Manager and Moorhead City Council on the attached listings for capital improvement projects throughout the Moorhead Park System.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

As per the City of Moorhead resolution #87-410, the Park Advisory Board (PAB) is asked to give recommendation on the Parks and Recreation Department's needs including facilities, programs, future park locations, ongoing capital improvements, and maintenance of existing assets.

On an annual basis, the PAB reviews and prioritizes capital projects for the Parks Department. The process for this review consists of staff assembling information from a variety of sources including.

- Staff developed a list of Capital Improvement Projects (CIP) requests and makes recommendations to the Park Advisory Board. The following is the process for a project to be included on the listing:
 - A request by Moorhead citizens who have contacted the Park Department, City Council or Park Board Members.
 - A review of the Playground Assessment information.
 - A review of the existing five-year capital project list that is part of the City of Moorhead annual budget.
 - Discussion on larger items that are too expensive to be included as a Capital Improvement request, (i.e Community Center).
- The Park Board then goes through the list at a workshop in January or February of each year to add items and prepare for prioritization and approval at the next meeting. Some of the priority items fit into the annual recommendation to be funded through Park Amenities. Staff also recommend projects based on priority and operational needs.
- The City Manager has instructed staff to provide a 5-year Capital Improvement Plan. The Finance Director has provided anticipated funding levels for the 5-year plan and projects have been placed according to priority. After the Park Board has approved the prioritization of the projects, the 2027 CIP list will go to the Finance Director and City Manager to review. They will then send this on to the Mayor and City Council who will review and approve items based on available funds.

- Included in the attachment is the 5-year Capital Improvement Projects which details the 2027 recommendations for Parks, Golf Courses, and the breakdown of Park Amenities spend.

There may also be projects that will need to be added to the list throughout 2027 that are currently unanticipated. These are typically due to mechanical failure, the addition of a new program, etc. Any changes to the project list will be brought back to the PAB for discussion.

Items that have changed since last review include:

- The annual Capital Improvement Funds allocation for Parks and Golf was reduced to meet the funding projections for 2027.
- The Picnic Shelter Fund allocation was combined with the Playground Replacement Fund allocation to support the Gooseberry Park project.
- The Park Amenities Fund allocation includes the smaller project of Loader Fork Attachment for unit #458PM.

SUBJECT: Recommendation – 2027 Parks Department Fees

RECOMMENDATION: The Park Advisory Board is asked to review the proposed 2027 program fee schedule and make a recommendation for approval to the Moorhead City Council for inclusion into the City's 2027 budget.

BACKGROUND/KEY POINTS:

On an annual basis, the Parks and Recreation staff recommend a series of fee adjustments for programs. These adjustments are made to recover increases in direct costs associated with program delivery, while staying within the regional market for participant pricing. By resolution, the PAB is given the opportunity to review and comment on the proposed Parks and Recreation Department program and facility fees prior to final approval by the Moorhead City Council.

Generally, adult recreation programs are priced to receive 100% of direct costs or more. Youth programs aim to meet the 100% goal as well, but often fees are insufficient to cover the direct costs of program delivery and result in modest subsidies. The city looks to recover at a minimum, 50% of direct costs for youth programs.

Some of the changes being recommended in the Fee Schedule for 2027 include:
Programs:

The attached document compares the 2026 Fargo and West Fargo Park District's rates with Moorhead's, where possible (See Attachment 1). Program logistics are not always similar between the Cities, but it gives a broad overview. For example, a swim pass in Fargo offers 6 pools with several water park amenities, while Moorhead offers one pool.

Some of the program areas that are being recommended for fee changes include:

- Price adjustments and simplification of shelter rentals.
- Hjemkomst Center meeting room rate adjustments for 2027.
- Golf is seeing modest increases for 2027. Most notably is 9-hole green fee after it stayed flat in 2026.

Facilities and User Agreements:

- Unique to Moorhead are the neighborhood wading pools. The wading pools have always been a popular neighborhood amenity where families gather to allow their toddler to swim, free of charge. There are pool attendants, but no lifeguards on duty.
- There are 8 hockey and 10 pleasure rinks available throughout the city for skating. 7 parks having warming houses that are staffed. These are also free of charge.
- Open Gym for youth is free and open to the public. Adults pay a modest fee.
- Special events such as River Arts, Frostival, Greater Moorhead Days, Dive into Summer, Kids Fest, Trunk, or Treat, etc., continue to be free to the public. These events require community sponsorship but are very well attended by the public.
- After School Adventures held at Village Green is a free program for participants through the Community Development Block Grant program.
- Senior programming held at the Moorhead Senior Center is offered at no charge. Events held at other locations may have a fee if the facility charges a fee for use.

Annually staff also reviews programs for removal from our offerings that have not met participant requirements (8 people) over a two-year period or where staffing has become impossible to find. There are no programs to eliminate from our offerings in 2027.

FINANCIAL CONSIDERATIONS: The 2027 proposed fee schedule remains competitive in the local market, while increasing program revenue. Scholarships are available for qualified participants through the Moorhead Parks and Recreation Office for Moorhead Parks and Recreation programs only.

2026 MOORHEAD MUNICIPAL POOL – FIRST SEASON IN REVIEW

We had an incredible first season at the new Municipal Pool! After years of planning and anticipation, it was exciting to finally see the new facility come to life and watch our community enjoy it throughout the summer.

First Season Highlights

- 648 – Grand Opening Attendance
- 5 – Large Special Event Days
- 15 – Oasis Party Room Rentals – New option for families to celebrate special occasions at the pool.
- Attendance Growth – We welcomed more than 11, 000 additional guests compared to the 2024 season. It was exciting to see how quickly the community embraced the new facility.
- Upgraded Concessions – We expanded our concession options to include hot food, giving guests more choices and making the overall pool experience even better.
- Moorhead's first Splash Pad – Offered extended daily hours giving families more opportunities to enjoy the new facility. This amenity will remain open with adjusted hours through September 7.
- New Programming – Water Board Yoga and Balance
- Record Water Exercise Attendance – The design of our new pool allowed us to increase participation by providing more space and better setup. We had 41 participants in the class.
- National Recognition – We wrote an article for the National Recreation and Parks Association (NRPA) magazine highlighting our new universal locker room. This will be published in the fall edition.

Programming

Swim Lessons

Our swim lessons returned in full this summer and it was great to see so many families take advantage of lessons at the new pool. We offered a variety of lessons including Adaptive Swim, Parent/Child, Private Lessons and Group lessons level 1-6. Private Lessons continue to be a popular choice for families, providing individuals with one-on-one opportunity to learn at their own pace. We have our own swimming curriculum and conduct all training in-house. We had over 400 participants enrolled in swimming lessons this summer.

Lap Swim/Water Walking

These are unstructured exercise times at our facility. In June and July, sessions were offered at 5:30pm and in August we moved the time to 11am. We created a Mile Swim Club Challenge, encouraging swimmers to track their laps and work toward completing 5, 10, 15, and 20 miles, with a prize awarded at each milestone. A total of 316 people participated in these sessions this summer.

Water Board Yoga and Balance

We offered 3 classes in August and received strong interest and great feedback. We marketed it as a “bucket-list experience” that participants wouldn’t want to miss. These one-day classes were a great option for those with busy schedules who weren’t looking for a long-term commitment. A total of 27 people participated in the classes.

Water Exercise

This continues to be a popular program at the pool. This class is designed for all fitness levels. We offer a variety of different resistant bands and weights to accommodate various abilities and fitness needs. We had 41 participants in the class.

Special Events

We had several events throughout our first season at the new facility, creating additional opportunities for families and the community to enjoy the pool and surrounding amenities.

Grand Opening – June 4th

Essentia donated beach towels to the first 500 people through the door, adding to the excitement of opening day. Families and staff were excited to celebrate the first day at our new facility, with 648 people attending the grand opening.

Make A Splash Days – June 26, July 24, August 14

Essential Health sponsored three free swimming days at the pool this season. These events were a great opportunity to provide free access to the facility and encourage community members to experience the new pool. At the July event, Essentia provided free goggles to the first 500 people. Combined, the three events brought more than 1,900 people through our doors.

Summer Splash – July 16

This free event is a long-standing tradition at the Municipal Pool. Pepsi sponsored admission fees and provided free products for attendees. While this year’s event looked a little different because the grass areas for the water inflatables were not yet established, it was still a great success. The Oasis Room featured several local businesses offering games and activities for kids. We also had trivia, tattoos, diving contest, skating tutorials at the skate park, and various games. US Bank provided several volunteers who helped with these activities. We had over 600 people in attendance.

Family Swim Night – August 14

This event was new this summer! We wanted to create an opportunity for families to visit the pool before the start of the school year. Moorhead Public Service sponsored admission fees and provided fun giveaways and promotional items. The evening included prize drawings, Minute to Win It games, and several businesses offering activities outside the pool area. More than 500 people attended, which was an outstanding turnout for an August event. Based on the success, we plan to offer a similar event again next summer.
